To prepare for the Nurse Maude Sunday I took the time to read up on the life of Nurse Sibylla Maude. A number of things stood out. First of all she was a devoted Anglican. It was out of her Christian devotion and her regular praver life that she served others Whenever she could she would worship with the Anglican Nuns at the Community of the Scared Name and it was their model of caring that she adopted as her own. She wasn't afraid to take on the authorities. Like many Anglicans she strongly supported votes for woman. She made the best of modern techniques and training. She was one of the first to have a telephone and a car. Finally, although she worked like a Trojan, she took regular breaks. She went for what she called "spiritual healing" to Palestine. There is much more that could be said of course, but like the Good Samaritan she was moved by compassion for others. Our connection is that she is buried at St Peter's.

Shoebox Gifts - for impoverished children overseas


Help build the church overseas by filling a shoebox with gifts. The shoebox you pack will very likely be the first gift the child has ever received.
