THE YEAR OF GROWING

#### From The Rev. Marcia Hardy

This week I was asked 'What is your favourite passage of Scripture? Immediately I thought of Psalm 139, particularly as Nigel Eastgate writes in his beautiful hymn:



"If I take the wings of the morning to fly with them over the sea, no matter how far or how fast I've flown, I'll not be alone, my God is forever with me".

Although we don't often hear the psalms in our services these days we do read them at our daily Morning Prayers. Lately I've been noticing how often they speak to me in a very deep way.

Today's psalm, 91, is another favourite. There again we find that beautiful image of God's sheltering wings. Jim Cotter's version reads "You overshadow me with your wings, I am safe under your feathers. As a mother protects her brood, you are strong and tender towards me. With your faithfulness as shield and defence, I have courage to face any danger".

The safety that we find in God isn't to be taken literally. Christians can still get sick and die, or be killed on the roads or in a war. So how can we see the promises of these psalms in the context of the greater crises and uncertainty of life?

The psalmist speaks of a deeper safety promised by God to the faithful; a promise that offers more security and safety than the world is able to give. It is a promise that even in the midst of tragedy and death, ultimately, the final word is hope.
