THE YEAR OF GROWING

From our Vicar....

One of the games that we have all played and that we teach our children is musical chairs. In case you haven't played it, or it's been a long time, the



idea is simple. There is a circle of chairs usually back to back and the players walk around it. There is one chair too few. When the music stops one person misses out. A chair is removed. The music starts and off you go. Finally only one chair remains and that person is the winner. I used to like playing this as a kid because I was always tall, so it was easy to push another child out of the way!

But what if Jesus was playing this? I'm going to suggest that Jesus' musical chairs would go in reverse. Starting with one chair, a new chair would be added each time, until everyone has a seat, everyone belongs.

Biblical scholars call this radical inclusion of Jesus the 'Messianic Inversion'. It's what he is on about in today's Gospel. "Take the least seat at a banquet, and when you hold a dinner, invite the poor and lame and blind, those who can't pay you back." A community living the Jesus way is very different. Even the children's games start to mess with your head.
