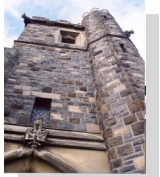

Clergy Comment from our Priest Assistant...

Today is Refugee Sunday, when we celebrate the contributions of refugees in our community and remember the men, women and children displaced or forced from their homes by persecution, torture, death and war.

CWS notes that "each day 42,500 people who once led ordinary lives, leave their homes in a desperate search for safety. The tragic stories of those lost in the Mediterranean Sea that receive the headlines are a fraction of the total." According to UN figures, there are over 65.3 million forcibly displaced people around the world. Under international law, refugees are entitled to protection and assistance, but in reality they often experience social exclusion, largely by being ignored, marginalised or barred by country borders.

First century Jews had a custom that if they went onto foreign soil, they would wipe the foreign dust off their feet on their return. It was a sign of their belief about the holiness of the land of Israel that they didn't want to contaminate it with the soil of pagan lands. But Jesus makes a new distinction. Those places where his disciples are welcomed are sacred places, regardless of whether or not they are in Israel.

May we continue to welcome all who come to us, and offer God's peace and acceptance in this sacred place.
