

From our Vicar....

For about a month I have been circling the screwdriver set I want from Mitre 10 and putting the catalogue under my daughter's pillow in case she forgets



that today is Father's Day. Today there will be Fathers up and down the country getting screwdriver sets, breakfast in bed and a set of hankies.

Behind the money making is a serious concern to honour our Fathers. A recent survey puts the number of children growing up in homes with their Mum and Dad at 6 percent. In other words the vast majority of kids don't enjoy having a biological mum and dad. This is not to say that other parents aren't doing a wonderful job. Many parents and grandparents and whanau raise children and do a fantastic job. But alongside the Chatham Island Black Robin and the Canadian Godwit we need to put fathers on the highly endangered species list.

There are lots of reasons for this. And it takes 2 not to tango, but sometimes it's because dad simply leaves. Many families have to get by without a dad. If you added to the survey the percentage of dads who went to church with their kids, they become very endangered indeed.
