As some of you know I'm the acting archdeacon for this area while The Venerable Susan Baldwin is away. I had to lead my first clergy gathering on Tuesday and was praying what to say. A verse came to me, Luke 12:32. "Do not be afraid little flock it is the Father's great pleasure to give you the kingdom." As if by magic when I looked up the Gospel for today, there it was! The command not to be afraid sings out very clearly from the Bible. Someone with too much time on their hands counted that phrase, 365 times in the Bible. "Do not be afraid." I guess every day we need to be reminded. Clever people like Archbp Rowan Williams and Elizabeth Kubler Ross tell us that there are only 2 basic human emotions. Fear and Love. Every other emotion is a variation of these two. That's why we read in Scripture; "perfect love casts out all fear."

As Christians in our world we can feel like a little flock, but we do not need to fear. God is working his purpose out. We need rather to learn to live in love. Love is expansive. When we know we are loved and cherished by God, then we can be open in our dealings with others. We can expand beyond our small circle of friends and those we feel safe with.

Ghost Riders Racing in the Sky (A Children's Racing Story)

In the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries some boys attending St. Peter's Church Sunday School rode ponies to the Church.

Budding jockeys saw this as a great opportunity to have phantom races and one such race happened on the third Sunday in October 1888.

The race was on in earnest when the lamplighter, being about ten metres clear of the chasing pack, reached St. Peter's Church Glebe suddenly eased down and pulled up because he noticed Robert Derrett walking Carbine across the Glebe.

The chasing pack followed suit and Derrett allowed the boys to pat the champion and gave them good tuition on riding.

The boys attended Sunday School and at the end of the lesson the teacher asked one of the boys what was the highlight of Sunday School to which the boy replied "seeing and patting Carbine".

Sadly for the racing public Carbine sailed for Australia that week and never returned.

Robert Derrett was laid to rest in St. Peter's Churchyard in 1937 but remembered the church in his will, leaving two hundred pounds to it.
