From our Priest Assistant Marcia

Over the years, we've gone to New Brighton beach on Guy Fawkes' night to marvel at the fireworks display from the pier. It's surprising that we still remember the 1605 "Gunpowder Plot", when a group of rebel Roman Catholics attempted to overthrow the government ,but perhaps the excitement of a bonfire and fireworks keeps up the tradition. But November 5th also marks an anniversary of greater significance in our country. In the 1870s, the Taranaki settlement of *Parihaka* was the largest Maori village in the country. This self-sufficient community, led by prophets Te Whiti o Rongomai and Tohu Karahi, was created by Maori who were dispossessed during the land conflicts. On this day in 1881 Parihaka was invaded by 1500 militia and armed constabulary. They were greeted by singing children and 2000 residents with a peaceful resistance. The army demolished the settlement, and when people tried to prevent further Government confiscations of land by building fences, many were arrested and imprisoned without trial.

The invasion of *Parihaka* came to be seen as a black day in New Zealand's history, but today this town hosts an international peace festival, and is becoming a powerful symbol of peace.*Marcia*
