What are you giving up for Lent? I tried to give up chocky biscuits, but sadly couldn't resist the temptation.

Originally, Lent was the time of the year for those wishing to become Christians to prepare for baptism.

For 40 days before Easter, these 'catechumens' would study, pray and fast.

Those who were already Christian would often join in the preparation to show solidarity with the catechumens; and also to deepen and strengthen their own faith.

This is the emphasis the Anglican Church gives to Lent In dioceses all over the world Lenten studies are offered; and each year the Archbishop of Canterbury suggests a book that can be used for Lenten devotions.

As Justin Welby says about Lent:

Growing closer to God is at the heart of a good Lent. We come to a time of fasting, discipline and study, in order that we may renew our knowledge of His presence

That involves a stripping of those things that divide us from God, developing our obedience to His call and venturing deeper into the fire of His love.

Fortunately, for we who like our chocolate, a spiritual book is a good Lenten option.
