symbols of light and life, in order to help us comprehend the incomprehensible. We have eggs - a symbol of new life; bunnies - a symbol of fertility; empty crosses - a symbol of hope; and the Easter candle. But in the end no symbols however powerful, or the personal conviction of millions both alive and now at peace, can convince me or you, of the reality of Resurrection. There is no substitute for a real relationship with Jesus that begins in our lives.

Lee Strobel, a New York Times journalist and lawyer, took time out of his busy career, to investigate for himself the evidence for the resurrection. He brought his special legal eye to the medical evidence, the evidence of the missing body, the evidence of the appearances and much more besides. In the end he found himself reluctantly at first becoming a believer. "For me," he writes, "it was like a rush of reason. Looking back this was the pivotal point in my life. Over time my character, values, attitude, priorities, worldview, philosophy and relationships all began to change for the good."

This change for good was most obvious to his 5 year old daughter. She had previously known dad as profane, drunk, harsh and mostly just plain absent. But after this change of heart she walked up to her mum one day and said, "Mummy, I want God to do for me what he's done for Daddy".
