Theme for the Year: Strengthening

From Vicar, Nick

"And Jesus wept." John 11:35 The shortest verse in the whole Bible appears in today's Gospel. Here we see Jesus, not the powerful Lord of all creation but a vulnerable human person weeping at the death of a friend. We can be sure that for John to record Jesus' tears they had a profound impact on those around him. It would be easy to rush over this short verse and not reflect on its significance. It shows us a saviour who is not aloft from human suffering far off in the clouds, but knows us intimately and suffers alongside us.

Lament for a Son by Nicholas Wolterstorff, is a book written to help its author come to terms with the tragic death of his son. For Nicholas, a lecturer in theology, the untimely death of his son was a profound challenge to his faith and his emotional wellbeing. In the book he outlines his struggle but also his conclusion, that God is the one who suffers with us. He writes, "the tears of God are the meaning of history".

Most of us every day come face to face with suffering, in our own lives or the lives of others. In Jesus we have a saviour who knows our pain and who suffers with us. That's the sort of friend I need. A real person who knows my pain first hand and who feels it with me.

"And Jesus wept."
