The family and I were watching the Crusaders against the Lions last week.

My wife, Yaeko, asked me one of those technical rugby questions we blokes should know.

'Why are the Crusaders' jerseys different today?'

I was about to launch into an explanation of home and away kits – those different colours teams wear not to clash with the opposition – when I realised the Crusaders were not in their alternative chain mail-grey jersey. I had to reply 'I don't know'.
