This week we celebrate the life of Nurse Maude – a devout Anglican whose ministry flowed from being a disciple of Christ.

Every registered nurse in New Zealand receives the five pointed NZ nursing medal. The design of the medal reflects the ideals that guided Nurse Maude as she cared for Christchurch's sick and dying 100 years ago:

- 1 The Hand – That my hand shall ever extend to help, comfort and relieve the sick and suffering
- 2 The Foot – That my feet shall not falter, loiter or linger, when journeying to alleviate the suffering of the sick.
- 3 The Knee – That my knee shall bow to the Almighty Creator in asking for guidance and aid in my endeavours
- 4 The Head – That I would constantly pursue study and exercise my knowledge to benefit those who are suffering bodily or mental distress.



We give thanks and pray for the nursing community that cares for us;
and may the words of their star inspire us too.

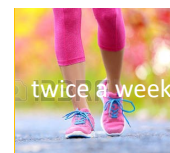
