

From Our Deacon Assistant, John ...

Hymns ancient or modern?

One of the biggest divisions in Christianity today is not between Catholic and

Protestant, Anglican or Methodist, it is in styles of worship. The main division on a Sunday morning is between those worshiping in a contemporary style; and those singing hymns.

The problem with this dichotomy is that a kind of spiritual apartheid has developed. The more mature and elderly gather to sing "How Great Thou Art"; and the teenagers and young families are elsewhere singing "10,000 Reasons".

Is there no way that the two groups could actually worship together?

One positive development in the past 10 years is what is called the "New Hymn Movement." A group of younger musicians in traditional churches have rediscovered hymns. They take Charles Wesley and Fanny Crosby and play them in a key, style and rhythm that the younger generation are more familiar with; sometimes even writing new tunes to old hymn favourites.

The result has been dramatic. A new generation is singing hymns with gusto; and singing them with their parents and grandparents.
