When I first went to university, a Christian friend expressed concern saying, 'You could lose your faith.' He was genuinely worried that secular varsity would lead me to question what the church had taught me. Well, it did; and it was a good thing.

Questions are the way God leads us to truth.

In this Sunday's Gospel there is a lot of questioning: What is the greatest commandment? Whose son is the Messiah?

Characters in Matthews Gospel ask a lot of questions, more than any other book in the Bible. It is the way Matthew works out who Jesus is and what it means to follow him.

Sometimes we think Christianity is all about the certain answers we can offer. But our answers are only the product of asking quality questions.

What question would you like God to answer? Asking it – and seeking out the answer – could make for a fun week.


