Happy New Year!

In a few more weeks, the new Church Year will begin. December 3 is the first Sunday of Advent. We Anglicans follow a year that is out of sync with the Gregorian year which begins January 1. This secular year merely marks the day of the week on a calendar. Our Church Year follows the life of Christ.

I recently saw this explanation of the Church Year on a Sunday School whiteboard:

Advent = Jesus is Coming Christmas = Jesus is born Ordinary Time = Jesus teaches Lent = Jesus journeys to the cross Three days = Jesus is crucified and dies Easter = Jesus Rises Pentecost = The Holy Spirit comes

It is a good explanation but misses one important element. The Church Year is not just about what happened to Jesus. It is also about what happens to us as his followers. Our list could also read:

Advent = We long for life and light Christmas = We are born anew Ordinary Time = We grow in grace Lent = We recognise our weakness Three days = We die to sin Easter = We are risen with Christ. Pentecost = We are filled with the Spirit

It certainly will be a happy new year.
