was reading our Anglican 'A New Zealand Prayer Book' recently.

I was reading the parts of the 'Liturgy of the Eucharist' that are written in italics.

These are the instructions of when to stand, sit, kneel, or what the priest should be doing.

They are like the operating manual that comes with your mobile phone.

What surprised me was how often the word 'Silence' or "Silence mov be kept' appeared in these instructions. But why have silence during the Eucharist?

Pope Benedict XVI writes: 'Silence is part of the liturgy....

The greater mystery, surpassing all words, summons us to silence.

Silence is not just the absence of speech and action.

We should expect the liturgy to give us a positive stillness that will restore us.

Such stillness will not be just a pause, in which a thousand thoughts and desires assault us, but a time of recollection, giving us an inward peace,

allowing us to draw breath and rediscover the one thing necessary..."

May the times of silence during our Eucharist restore us all.
