Catechism for Lent - Part 3



I believe

Last week we noted we are saying the Apostles Creed during Lent.

Our catechism questions this week explore the creed more fully, leading us from a reflection on sin to our new life in Christ.

What is baptism?

Baptism in water is the sacrament of new birth in Christ. We die to sin that we may live his risen life.

We are washed by the Holy Spirit and become members of the Church.

What is the Church?

The Church is the pilgrim people of God, the body of Christ and the community of disciples in every age in earth and heaven.

Child of God, how will this shape the journey of your life?

By God's grace, I will seek to understand my faith and be able to give a reason for the hope that is in me.

Now that we understand the basics of what we believe - which we profess at our baptism; and each week – our catechism, next week, leads us on to reflect on how we live our faith in prayer, worship and service.
