#### The Gospel of Mark

Every Sunday, we Anglicans listen to the words of Jesus as proclaimed in the Gospels. In 2018, we will read through most of the Gospel of Mark.

The Gospel of Mark is one of the central documents of Christian faith. It was the first Gospel to be written and both Matthew and Luke borrow much of Mark for their Gospels.

Mark presents a vivid picture of the preacher Jesus and of those who strongly opposed him.

Today, when we read Mark's Gospel, it is read in private, maybe as part of a morning quiet time, or small sections are read aloud at church. This dripfeed reception of the Gospel robs it of much of its potency.

Mark did not write his Gospel to be read in chapters, to be read silently, nor to be read at home. He wrote his Gospel to be read in one sitting, to be read aloud, and to be performed at Church. That is why Mark's Gospel is short, to the point, and vivid.
