From Our Vicar, Nick

I wonder what you fear?

Most of us when we are honest with ourselves have lots of fears. We might fear what others think, or fear that we won't be

able to support ourselves, or we might be worried about our health or our children's decisions, or ... the list goes

Today in our reading from Mark we have a window onto the fears of Herod Antipas. Not to be confused with Herod The Great. Herod fears John the Baptiser, he fears his wife, he fears the Jewish people and he fears Rome. All this conspires to make him execute John.

Reading with modern eyes we are shocked at the brutality of cutting John's head off. But for Herod this would have just been another day at the office. Herod is a contradiction of competing fears and we see the terrible outcome.

In my fears I draw great strength from the line that appears in 1 John 4:18— "Perfect love casts out all fear". Psychologists tell us that we only have two basic emotions as humans; love and fear, all the rest take their lead from these.

How different Herod's actions would have been if they had been from a place of love not fear.

How different our lives would be, if we could trust our fears to the love we see in Jesus Christ.


