Keeping the relationship alive

There's a saying that God has no grandchildren. What this means is that we can't have a second hand relationship with God, through another person. We each need our own direct living companionship with God. The revolutionary claim of the Christians is that Jesus is alive and we can have a direct, life giving and intimate relationship with him. The Bible tells us about the historical Jesus and this is vital but in the here and now Jesus is alive. It's as we enter into an intimate relationship with Jesus that our faith begins it make sense. We begin to experience for ourselves the all encompassing love that God has for us. We begin to see ourselves as God sees us. Our desires and hopes begin to be the desires and hopes that God has for us. There is no substitute for this sort of relationship.

We keep this intimate relationship with Jesus alive through prayer. There is no substitute for prayer. Just as when we have a friend there is no substitute for spending time with that person. You can tell someone who prays; they are slower to judge others, they are quicker to see the good in other people, they sit lightly with what they own and worry less about the future. They are more likely to embrace change and laugh more readily and know a deeper joy in their lives. In short they are more Christlike. In fact research shows that they live longer and have less illness as well. 800 years ago St Richard put the longing, that we all have for a first hand relationship with the living Christ, in a prayer.

"O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, may I know thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, and follow thee more nearly, day by day." Amen.
