


Clothes Maketh the Priest

A new member of St Peter's recently asked me why Anglican priests wear different clothes at the services on Sundays.

It is a good question and one a few more seasoned Anglicans would have trouble answering. There are 3 main items (vestments) worn:

- 1. The **Alb** is a long white garment that is worn over ordinary clothing. Often, a cincture (rope cord) is used around the waist so that the alb can fit properly.
- 2. The **Stole** is worn by the priest around his neck. It is a long, narrow rectangular vestment that will also bear the colour of the liturgical season.
- 3. The **Chasuble** is a vestment that comes in many colours and the priest wears the particular colour of the liturgical season. The Chasuble is worn over the alb and stole.

Why we wear these is the more interesting story; and will be revealed in a subsequent Bulletin.
