

## From our Assistant Priest-John

### A Prayer Book

I was recently asked by a person from another denomination, 'How do you Anglicans pray'.



Traditionally, and still today, we often use a service from our prayerbook called Morning Prayer. We pray in the morning because it is the time of Christ's resurrection: as the new light breaks we pray to be made new in him.

Morning prayer follows a simple pattern:

- 1 We ask God to be with us
- 2 We read a Psalm
- 3 We read a short passage of scripture
- 4 We spend some time in silence meditating on the scripture
- 5 We pray: thanking God for the good things we experience; and asking for grace to help us and others in our need
- 6 We finish with the Lord's Prayer.

If you would like to explore this way of praying, just google "Daily Prayer Short Form - The Scottish Episcopal Church" for a free download.

Another good introductory prayer book is: "Common Worship: Time to Pray."

Also Nick and I meet each morning at 9am in the York room for morning prayer from "A NZ Prayer Book." A couple of visits to pray with us would also be a helpful introduction to morning prayer.
