From our Vicar Nick....

You may not have seen the opinion piece in Saturday's Press. It was very good. The anonymous author highlighted the growth of social isolation in our society. They stated that in the last 4 weeks 650,000 kiwis (people not birds!) felt lonely. Or 14% of the population. Those aged 15-24 are the loneliest. The writer demonstrated how in a time of increasing "connectedness" with technology there is alongside it a growing disconnectedness. Simple human contact can be hard to find, as banks have fewer tellers, businesses go online and supermarkets have automatic tellers. (Which I find so hard to use!)

The opinion writer rightly points out that we need others. What they didn't or couldn't point out is that we are made in the image of God, who as trinity, is a community of love. We therefore thrive best in community.

People suffering from poor mental health often are disconnected from others.

Church fulfills many human needs, not least of which is our need for others. When we come to church, we are doing a radically counter cultural thing. We are gathering with others. There is no other community (that I can think of) that the only prerequisite is to be human. You can come to church if you are young, old, rich, poor, male, female or whatever. Every other gathering either requires money to get in, or is based on a common interest, e.g. sport.

Jesus, in today's Gospel, has his mind changed. He has his vision expanded to connect the non Jew in his mission. That's good news for us.

Church is about being connected. Being connected to others, being connected to God. Coming to church forms part of God's plan for our wellbeing.
