Together we passed a huge milestone last Sunday afternoon. At the Special Meeting we agreed unanimously to



allow Church Property Trustees to hold \$500,000 of our funds for the restoration work of St Peter's Church.

This doesn't mean we can stop fundraising as we need this money back, but it does mean work can begin in earnest.

One of the things I miss about not being in the Church are the beautiful stained glass windows. Easily the most striking stained glass this side of the black stump!

In a children's talk, a wee girl told me once that the saints are like stained glass because God shines through them.

Today we celebrate the saints. One we celebrate today was a foot inspector in China, another a compassionate warrior in the land wars, yet another a medieval intellectual archbishop, the 4th a gentle Celtic missionary and a sometimes flaky Palestinian fisherman. Taken together we see in the saints an image of divine light that illuminates our lives too.
