A friend of mine is a recovering

alcoholic. He makes a point of saying, "recovering" because there is no cure but he has been "dry" for many years. To talk to him about his story is a very worthwhile conversation, there is something for all of us in his story. Firstly he had to admit he had a problem and to seek help. But what for him was a massive turning point was that moment when with the help of Alcoholics Anonymous he was directed to admit without God's help he was powerless to overcome his addiction. Point 3 of the 12 step programme reads, "Make a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of

Today at the 9:30 am service we are witnesses to Lucy making a decision to turn her life over to God, in baptism. That's not to suggest for one second that she is an alcoholic! Rather she is doing what we all must do. Admit that we need God in our lives and that with God we can have a more fulfilling and abundant life. Paradoxically in our human nature we need something more than ourselves. We need a higher loyalty. On our own we can't do it, even with the best self help books.

Hans Kung the famous German theologian is quoted recently as saying, "I am a Christian in order to be fully alive". God wants only the very best for Lucy today and for all of us too.
