

I recently saw this explanation of the Church Year on a

Sunday School whiteboard:

Advent = Jesus is Coming
Christmas = Jesus is born
Ordinary Time = Jesus teaches
Lent = Jesus journeys to the cross
Three days = Jesus is crucified and
dies



Easter = Jesus Rises

Pentecost = The Holy Spirit comes.

It is a good explanation but misses one important element. The church year is not just about what happened to Jesus, It is also about what happens to us as his followers.

Ordinary Time = We grow in grace
