Last weekend I spent quite a bit of time with a Muslim family in Spreydon, listening to them as they shared their fears and uncertainties and just being a Christ-like presence in their grief over what had happened in this city they now call home. It was an amazing experience, sharing their space and being allowed to pray over them!

God reminds us this week that He doesn't inflict pain and tragedy on us, His creation, and we cannot place blame on Him for the choices humanity makes. The challenge for us here, is to remember this as the days move in to weeks and the weeks in to months.

An immigrant who moved here with her family from British Columbia after the Earthquakes was asked what she liked about our city:

"I like the people! New Zealanders are happy people always ready to lend a hand. From the moment we arrived, we have met so many incredibly kind people. Kiwis are so friendly and they care about their "neighbours". There is also quite a sense of community. It might be part of a city coming together after such devastating earthquakes all those years ago, but it makes you feel a little less homesick."

On top of that Christchurch is a very diverse city with people from all over the world living here and the weather is pretty nice too."

Let us continue to hold our city in prayer and remember that we can get through this difficult time if we stand together: unity in diversity!
