On Wednesday, our AAW Group hosted Senior Sergeant Kelly Larsen from the Christchurch Police.

As she spoke about her life in the Police Force and the challenges of being a female in this male-dominated career path, Senior Sergeant Kelly emphasised her personal need to be humble and respectful in her vast dealings with people of different races, creeds and socioeconomic levels. A few years ago, serving in the Solomon Islands together with other Pacific & Australian forces in

the civil unrest that held the country hostage, the difference in humanitarianism levels was starkly noticeable between those of the NZ Police Force and members of neighbouring forces who displayed traits of stark racism towards the people they served.

This week we are challenged and encouraged by our lectionary readings to focus on the goodness of God, not holding on to past recriminations but embracing love for God and each other in humility and devotion. We are invited to hold on to that passion for faith that cuts through racial, economic and religious barriers.

During this final lap of our Lenten circuit, may Jesus be our total focus as we walk the last few days of our road to the cross. And as we approach Palm Sunday next week, may our hearts sing out our Halleluiahs and Praises for the King who brings us humility, for the Lord who brings us love.
