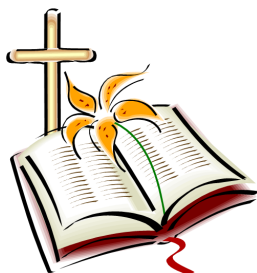

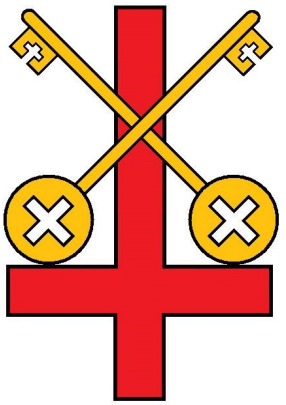

This Sunday at the family service, we will sing a contemporary hymn called Hallelujah is our Song.

Although the song was only written four years ago, the musical style draws on traditional folk music and the title of the song is taken from words preached by St Augustine in the fifth century.



One of our aims in the family service is not just to sing in a style familiar to our young folk but to also connect them to the wealth of our Christian tradition. When St Augustine wanted to get to the core of what Christian belief was he said, 'We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song'.

As one Anglican vicar put it 'Resurrection is more than a doctrine it is a reality to be lived each day'. We don't just remember the events of Easter, we too are raised with Christ to a new life. And as Easter people, our joy and call is found in bringing resurrection to the world we live in.

Now, that's a baton worth passing on.
