RESTORATION FUNDRAISING

While not reporting very much to you recently I can assure parishioners that our fundraising efforts continue unabated with some very heartening results. In very general terms we can confirm that of our original target of \$2.4 million we now have a shortfall of just over \$400,000 - an inspiring effort. But it would be wonderful to achieve the full goal within the next year so we do ask for your renewed effort.

Purchase of blocks (\$500 each) and stones (\$1000 each) ensure that names will be acknowledged within the restored church, and Living Bequests provide another valuable source of funds going forward. As you may be aware we had approached St. Peter's churches internationally and some success came from that, but we would now ask parishioners with contacts in other countries if they could seek support from the wider church family.
