

# The Family Service - Passing on the baton

As a parent, one of the big questions that I grapple with is: 'How do I pass on my Christian faith to my children? What in my family and church life will help them to be in relationship to God their Father and Maker?

When we look around at most Anglican churches, we see they are mainly populated with older folk. It is a sign that our ability to pass on the faith has not been our strong suit.

Recent research into the faith development of children indicate a number of factors that can help in growing their faith. One is that children who worship in church with their parents and take an active part in the service are more likely to continue to attend church when they become adults.

Each month, this is what happens in the family service: children, young people, parents and grandparents worship together – singing, praying and breaking bread as one. The service aims to combine the best traditions of Anglican worship with contemporary music and hymns. Our prayer and hope is that by doing this, we are building a church with a future; and passing on the baton.
