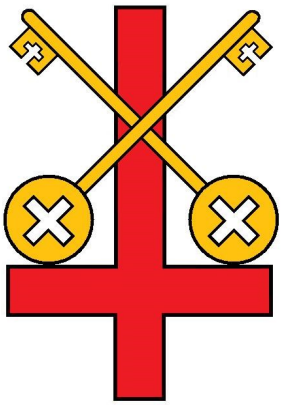

Nurse Maude Sunday



A typical day for Nurse Maude, began in prayer with the Community of the Sacred Name; the Anglican nuns, then she went to the local vicar to get a list of the sick in the parish. Then her rounds began. First on her bike, later she was given a Model T Ford. When she came into a house she always began by saying a prayer, then she gave medical assistance, then advice!



Like the 70 that Jesus sends out in the Gospel today, Sibylla Emily Maude saw herself as doing Jesus' work. Her heart of compassion, included not just home visits but challenging the status quo, for a better hospital, better care of TB patients, Spanish flu and eventually nursing registration.

One person stepping out in faith and trust. Today Nurse Maude has, 1300 staff and delivers homecare services in Canterbury, Wellington and Nelson Marlborough. Over 200,000 nursing visits to homes are done in her name each year. They also undertake 30,000 specialist clinic appointments, 30,000 Community Palliative care visits, 9,000 school based visits and 550,000 support worker visits in the home every year. Over 30,000 hours are given free by volunteers each year.

We are proud to have her at rest in our cemetery, may she rise in Glory.

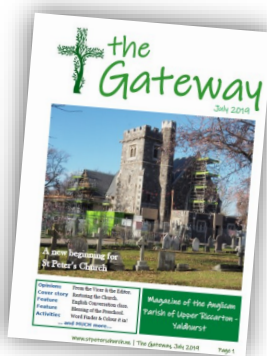


Preschool Enrolments
