

What?

Next week, the Family Service and 9.30 Service will combine for an instructed Eucharist. During an instructed Eucharist there is some commentary to explain why we do what we do on a Sunday. However, a more fundamental question needs to be asked first. What do we do?

Anglicans world-wide agree that there is a distinctive shape to Anglican worship. There are things we do in common that you will find if you attend an Anglican service in London, New York or Tokyo.

So what do we do on Sunday that creates this common worship:

- * We greet each other in the Lord's name
- * We confess our sins
- * We receive assurance of God's forgiveness
- * We keep silent and pray a Collect
- * We proclaim and respond to the Word of God
- * We pray for the Church and the World
- * We exchange the Peace
- * We prepare the Table
- * We give thanks
- * We break the bread
- * We receive Holy Communion
- * We depart with God's blessing to be a blessing in the world

The reason we follow this pattern of 'Common Worship' is not because it is legislated, but to symbolize our unity in Christ - that across the boundaries of nationality, race, gender or age, we are the one family of God.
