From the Gospel of Luke today, we hear the story of two disciples walking to the village of Emmaus. Their world has been turned upside-down. Jesus has been arrested and crucified; and their hope that Jesus would deliver them from Roman oppression has been dashed.

To his despairing friends, the resurrected Jesus draws near. They have trouble recognising him at first, but two things happen that open their eyes. First, Jesus 'opens up the scripture' for them, and they "feel on fire' as he converses with them. Second, he takes bread, blesses it, breaks it and gives it to them. And 'at that moment, opened-eyed, wide-eyed' they recognise him.'

These two experiences form the basis of our Anglican worship. On Sundays we don't just go to church. Instead, we gather as the disciples of Christ; to hear him speak to us through the scriptures; and to meet him in the breaking of the bread.

Each Sunday, when we get up and head to church, we are on our Emmaus Road, a road that will lead us into the lifegiving presence of Christ Jesus, our friend and brother.
