The Religion of Life

This weeks gospel tells the story of a woman bent double by an affliction. She has been this way for 18 years. In the middle of the service, Jesus calls to her and heals her. The priest of the synagogue is scandalised by this action and berates Jesus for healing on the sabbath.



It is a sad story in many ways because we have a deeply religious person missing the whole point of what gathering for worship is about. It is not about following a set of prescribed rules, but for the giving of thanks to God for God's blessings, mercy, and liberation.

What occupies our thoughts when we gather on a Sunday? Are we peeved that someone is not doing things according to our religious patterns or celebrating God's presence to bless us. Is Sunday morning a time to be grumpy or to shout alleluia?

Actually, today's story is not just about the healing of a woman bent double by pain, it is also the story of God's compassion for us when we are bent double by our religiosity. The story nudges us to see again that what is central to our faith is the celebration of God's life-giving presence among us.
