What this means is that the Bishop's power is limited, nor are we a total democracy without any leadership. We probably have friends who go to churches where the bishop is like a little dictator, or alternatively where everything is decided by



vote. Synods have been held since the earliest days of the church; what makes ours remarkable is the way we gather in 3 houses. Bishop, clergy and lay. This system was pioneered in New Zealand by Bishop Selwyn and has spread to the entire world! It means we work in partnership. In other words we need each other. Nor are we a congregational church where everything can be decided at the local parish level.

It would be easy to take this our synod system for granted, saying, "it's just another meeting." In reality many of our forbears worked very hard to make what we enjoy today, become a reality. Please pray for synod for your representatives, Jessica Lee, Paul Coleman and Sue Robb. Please pray for the clergy attending and for Corin Murfitt who represents Church property trustees. We need each other, across the Diocese and we need to be grateful that we can gather in freedom as a synod.


