

Yes Prime Minister

Today we ordain the Rev'd Llaisaane Kofe Kakala Havea to the order of priests. It's a very exciting occasion. I can remember my own ordination with a mixture of excitement and fear! Excitement at what lay ahead; fear at what lay ahead! After a long and careful process of discernment and training, people are set aside by the church to offer the ministry of priest. The ministry or task of a priest is to build up the Body of Christ through word and sacrament, pastoral care and teaching.



Often though we are guilty of fuzzy thinking around ministry. Sometimes people say to me, "when did you go into the church?" To which I answer; "when I was 6 weeks old!" Our going into the church happens when we are baptised. Ministry; the task of witnessing to Christ in our daily lives is the task of all the baptised. We are all ministers. I heard of one Vicar who put on the notice board, and pew sheet, "minsters all the baptised." Titles are confusing too. The vicar is the priest tasked with running a parish. The vicar stands in vicariously for the bishop. A parish has one vicar. A parish might have lots of priests in that parish though. You can retire being a Vicar but you remain a priest.

The Church needs leaders to be signs of unity, but priests are never the prime ministers. The prime minsters are the lay people. It is you who use the gifts of the spirit to serve God best in the community. In your daily life.

My prayer for Kofe is that she may have as much joy as I've discovered in this calling and that we might discover again the ministry of all the baptized. - Nick
