As we begin to think of the dynamics of returning to communal worship in our church space, and as we rejoice in the return of the builders to our church building, we are reminded this week that our 'gate' may not necessarily be those doors which have been shut on us for so long.

Not those locked doors overlooking the St Peter's Cemetery. Not those double doors which our Sunday morning rostered Welcomers hold open for us each week. Not the doors overlooking the carpark. These are not our gates.

The gate we should be polishing and cleaning for the day we come together again, and more so, for the day our church is re-opened, is our heart. And in each of our hearts, should stand Jesus - our gatekeeper! It is through our open and welcoming hearts that others in our community will want to enter into communion with Jesus.

And to be able to show Christ's warmth and love for those who might want to test the waters at St Peter's and St Luke's, it pays that we look at the Psalm set down for this Sunday too: Psalm 23, in which we are reminded that we are like sheep in the shepherd's fold: lacking nothing, having abundant provision, refreshed souls, being on the right track, fearlessness in dark times, even when the shepherd disciplines, overflowing blessings despite enemies around, and joy in God's house forever.
