

#### 1 degree

Kiwis are famous for claiming that everyone in the country is separated from everyone else by only 2 degrees. That means there is only 1 person between you and someone else. You can work this through in your mind. Think of someone famous, chances are you know someone who knows that person. Even if that isn't true there is still a phone company which claims it does!



Our Christian faith is based on 1 degree of separation. We can all, and we should all, have a personal relationship with Jesus. It's not enough to know someone else who does, although that's nice, or a grandparent who once did, although that's nice too. Each of us can have a direct relationship with God.

This is what our Gospel today celebrates. St Peter has an intimate life giving friendship with Jesus. This sort of faith is the rock that our Church is built on. But it's not enough that Peter had that sort of relationship, that would be 1000 degrees of separation; rather the invitation is for **each** of us to have this sort of faith.

We build the rock of our faith every time we pray, break bread together, and read the Bible.


Each meeting will have a speaker from both sides of the topic presenting their views. There will then be a chance for rebuttal before we accept questions from the floor.
