

On Rubber Gloves

When we were first married, my father-in-law very kindly gave me a set of rubber gloves. This, he explained, was so I could do the dishes every night! They had the label, "one size fits all" on them. As it turned out they fitted neither Rosemary, who has small beautiful hands, and I who have hands that would make a gorilla proud. One size just didn't fit all.



What's true of rubber gloves is also true of worship. I love Cathedral Evensong, whereas I have friends who are bored rigid by it. Many love 8am with its quiet and lack of music, others need a really good sing to praise God.

A couple of years ago we began a service called Family Church. (not family service.) Family Church is designed to be an Anglican Eucharist, (the family services of old, never had communion) that appeals to families. It is shorter, has a simpler great thanksgiving, an interactive sermon, and children involved in each of the parts. The time is a little later, 11am, and we finish with pizza. Like rubber gloves, this service fits some, but not all.

Following a request from the worshippers, Vestry is trialing having 2 months of unbroken family church to see how well it is supported. The vision is that children grow up with a service that helps them feel at home in an Anglican setting. 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays we are still all in together at 9:30am. Each term we will continue having a service with the preschool. The last of these was Gratitude Sunday. Family Church also has the added bonus of protecting the 9:30am, which so many love, from having to change too much to fit all.

In the meantime I have dishes to do!
