

Festival of Heritage

As part of the Christchurch City Council's 24 October - 8 November 2020 Festival of Heritage, a tour of our cemetery will be taking place from 2 p.m. - 5 p.m. on Saturday 31st October. Come and learn a lot of history! Here's a sneak peek:

"Just in front of the church lie the genteel Bowen brothers. Sir Charles was responsible for the 1877 Education Act which ensured that my grandparents and others of their generation got, at the least, a primary school education. Croasdaile was the Riccarton Parish's first vicar. His widow, Annette, was truly formidable. She owned a private girls' high school but was reluctant to see the daughters of the gentry do what she would consider wasteful - seek higher education. Far better to marry а prominent man, produce children and manage servants. She was, for 30 years, a supporter of Elizabeth Gardner's school of domestic instruction and lobbied many a minister of education for its development."
