

All of this at a time when we sing songs like "Joy to the World" and use phrases like "Peace on Earth."

When I look at our scriptures for today I cannot imagine anyone more stressed about the first Christmas than Mary. The Virgin Mary received one of the greatest surprises in history; a surprise that turned her world upside down. I have enjoyed my short time with you all, and I just want to say a massive THANK YOU for the good I have received and the fellowship we have shared. Look after each other; look after your Vicar; look after yourselves! And while you're at it, have a LOVELY Christmas!
