

This Christmas, give hungry families the basics of a sustainable life

Aarav may be shy but not when it comes to food. On the three days a week that the Vunilagi Book Club gives out free lunches, he races to join his friends eagerly waiting for the full plates that will soon come their way.

He knows what it is like to be hungry — the rumbling stomach, the lack of energy, the deeply troubling thoughts about whether he will ever eat again...

With his mother and three sisters, he lives in Fiji's Nanuku settlement on the outskirts of Suva. It has been a hard year for their community - many have lost jobs during the Covid-19 pandemic. They worry like so many others who live with the daily threat of hunger. The psalmist echoes their prayer, "Give us Life".

In another part of town, staff from the Pacific Conference of Churches have been busy at their Food Bank. Every Wednesday afternoon, they turn vacant land into a rich garden to feed the children of Nanuku and others in need. They stop to talk and share seeds and gardening tips with anyone who is interested as a practical expression of their faith. Already they are inspiring others to find their green fingers and live more sustainably upon God's earth. By sharing their love, justice will grow.

75 years of loving service

At the close of World War Two, the National Council of Churches launched the first Christmas Appeal by asking New Zealanders to remember "the millions in the east and the west, who are hungry. cold and homeless". The first appeal went to the people of Greece who had given food and shelter to New Zealanders during the fighting. For the last 75 years, your gifts have helped people in every corner of the world find the food, warmth and shelter they need for each day. Through our work together, you have supported local partners to tackle hunger at its root and made known God's love for the world.
