

Getting to know Rev'd Ken Light

Lynette and I are honoured to serve in St Peter's and St Luke's and especially in the newly rebuilt Church. We hail from the Dunedin diocese. Most of my early ministry was in Southland and Dunedin. We came to the Diocese of Christchurch in 2002 and served as Vicar of Glenmark-Waikari. When I retired in 2010 we moved to Rangiora. The earthquakes happened and I worked in Kaiapoi (red zone) with the Earthquake Support Service for Waimakariri District Council.



In the winter of 2011 I was asked to do a locum in the Parish of North Oamaru Waitaki Valley which led to our selling the Rangiora house and moving into the Vicarage in Oamaru. After five years, I retired for the second time and we moved to Lake Hawea where we had a holiday home. It wasn't long before the Vicar at Wanaka had me taking the occasional service in the Upper Clutha Parish.

Last year because of COVID-19 the country went in to lockdown. It exposed our vulnerability. Our children who live in Christchurch and Dunedin pointed out that we were a long way from them if anything should happen to us. Again, we sold up and moved to Rolleston where we now live just five minutes away from our daughter and husband and grandchildren, aged 9, 10 and 21. Since October last year we have worshipped in the Lincoln Parish where a lot of retired clergy live until Nick emailed just after Christmas to ask if we could help him out.
