Rieger's Return We are privileged to be hosting a recital from international concert organist Martin Setchell on Sunday 18th April at 2pm in St. Peter's. Martin is very generously donating his services as a fund-raiser for the reinstallation of our organ. After 40 years as Associate Professor of Music at Canterbury University, in 2014 he resigned his position in order to devote himself full time to his work as a professional freelance musician, performing, writing, speaking, editing and teaching. Since 1997, when he was appointed curator of the Rieger pipe organ by the City Council, he has devoted himself to promoting the concert instrument organ as a internationally. 2008 In he honoured by the city for his services to music and the Town Hall organ in partıcular.

Significantly Martin helped St. Peter's acquire our organ through his contact with the Austrian makers and gave the first inaugural recital exactly 20 years ago in 2001. While there will be no charge for entry those attending will be invited to make a retiring donation, hopefully a generous one, in response

to Martin's own generosity.
