

ANZAC DAY

Perhaps it was growing up in the UK, where Remembrance Day is the Sunday closest to 11 November, Armistice Day, that makes ANZAC Day falling on a Sunday feel special.

The last time it happened was in 2010. On that day, three of my son's comrades died when their RNZAF helicopter crashed on the hills around Wellington. While sitting in church I got

the text to tell me about the crash and to confirm that my son was not on board. You can imagine my relief. I can imagine the grief of the parents when they got the message that their sons had died; or can I? What must it be like to be told that your son or daughter has been killed in some far off land serving their country? Those who have lost family members to war are left to wonder what might have been; humanity is left wondering what those who were killed may have given to the world. But we will remember them.

War is not glorious nor should it be glorified but we as Christians have wars of a different sort to fight; wars against poverty, homelessness, mental illness, addiction, famine, climate change, and family violence. Just as we today remember those who gave their lives so we that we might live in peace and freedom, in years from now will people say that of us for the wars we need to wage on social injustice. Will they remember us?


