

For those of you who have green fingers and beautiful gardens or productive vegetable plots with fruit trees that produce more than you can reasonably eat or preserve, understanding the message of today's gospel will be easy. As we clean up the dead leaves swirling around the driveways or clean away the last of the foliage from the garden bulbs, you will be beginning to think about the pruning tasks. (I had to look up the best time to prune – so I know it's not just yet).



The vineyard is a common image in both the Old and New Testaments. When productive it is an image of prosperity, but it can be used when people are in trouble (the wild grapes of Isaiah). A good gardener knows the difference between the fruit-bearing branches and those that will be not be productive. The non-bearing branches must be pruned away so the plant can conserve strength for the good fruit. How does that work in the church? The fruit-bearing branches are those believers who abide in Christ and receive his love, forgiveness and who rejoice in his promise of abundant life.

What fruit will we bear? Love, joy, peace, patient endurance, kindness and compassion, generosity, gentleness and self-control, loving relationships (Galatians 5).

The True vine offers us eternal life. Christ has risen! Alleluia!
