Wild Geese

Celtic Christians chose, not the dove, but the wild goose as a symbol representing the Holy Spirit. The ancient Celts understood the Holy Spirit to be like a wild goose. It is one noisy, bothersome bird. This image of the Holy Spirit jars us out of our complacency. It corrects our overly safe and overly sweet image of the Spirit.



When the Spirit comes in the Bible, it never seems to be sweet or safe. God's Spirit called the prophets to speak to Israel in words that were bold and sometimes dangerous. Ezekiel saw a vision of God's Spirit blowing through a valley of dry bones and bringing them to life.

John the Baptist, dressed in camel's hair and eating wild locusts, proclaimed, "I baptize you with water but he who comes after me will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire." Paul gave this advice to young Timothy, "For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline."

It was this Holy Spirit that empowered the disciples gathered in the upper room at Pentecost so that they fearlessly and boldly proclaimed the good news about Jesus. The Church was born on that day and continues to the present.


Giving Tax Receipts
