

#### The Order of Lazarus

We welcome members of the Canterbury jurisdiction of Order of St Lazarus to St Peters 10am service. The international fraternity has a long history, It was established in 1098, during the first crusade, in a hospital for lepers located outside the walls of Jerusalem near the legendary nome of Saint Lazarus. Originally the monks were the hospitallers caring for the needs of the lepers and outcasts who roamed the Middle East and Europe. Later they became a military order to protect the lepers, as well as ministering to those afflicted with contagious diseases.



In the 13th Century the Order transferred its activities from Jerusalem to Acre in preparation for the final defence of the Holy Land. After the fall of Acre and the expulsion of all Christians from the Holy Land the Order moved it headquarters to France. It established leper hospitals known as lazer-cotes or lazarettes all over Europe. In the Middle Ages the Order fulfilled a dual mission. As a military power, it operated a flotilla of warship in the Mediterranean to protect sea routes against pirates. At the same time the hospitallers protected and treated the plague victims of Europe Europe.

The decline of leprosy in the West brought new challenges and opportunities for Christian endeavour: a growing spirit of ecumenism brought a need for Christian unity and relief for the victims of oppression around the world. Today the Order is a major force in humanitarian activity. It endeavours to maintain a Christian presence in the Holy Land by the construction and maintenance of medical facilities.

In recent years the Order has been engaged in a major programme to restore Christianity in Eastern Europe by providing food, clothing, medical equipment and supplies to former communist countries in Europe. The Order is represented throughout Europe, the Americas and Australasia and is open to men and women who are Christian and able to continue its philanth'ropic work.
