

This week we recognise the work of the Nurse Maude organisation. Sibylla (Sybil) Maude, to whom our Chapel of Compassion is dedicated, envisaged an organisation that provided care for any who needed it. From the start that care was about more than just nursing. Nurse Maude was a humble, compassionate friend of the most vulnerable and needy. She resigned her position as matron of Christchurch Hospital to care for the poor and



elderly who were unable to access hospital care because they couldn't afford it. Her district nurses were trained not just in medical care but in food and hygiene care to provide home help in situations where the family could not cope if mother was ill. She ran classes in mothering/parenting skills, ran soup kitchens and even advocated for better work conditions for nurses.

Nurse Maude was a devoted Anglican and kept up a close association with the nuns of the Community of the Sacred Name. She knew well the passage from Matthew 25 which reminds us that we meet God when we are meeting the needs of the marginalised in society. We show the love of Christ when we show compassion and support the least of these; and every time, we welcome Christ in our welcome of every one of those in need.

Let us pray that we may we be more Christlike in our lives, ever ready to stand alongside and support the needs and suffering of others.
